



Flashhack

14 July our Club will be 10 years old. As this anniversary approaches we take a look at some of the more significant developments since its inception.

In July 1973 the founders of the Club hoped that it would become an organisation which would cater for all the recreational pursuits of the local community.

In its first year our Club which grew out of the Jnr Football Club also catered for Little Athletics, Basketball and Cricket - not a bad start considering that there were virtually no local sporting facilities.

Basketball training was held at Rossmoyne High School with competition games at the Bill Cole Centre. Cricket had their home ground at Woodford Park, Lynwood.

During 1974 four more Divisions were created -Netbali, Chess, Tennis and Hockey - the Club was growing rapidly, but still there were no facilities in Willetton for basketball, netball, cricket, tennis and hockey. In an effort to convince the Town Council that sport-ing facilities were urgently needed in Will-etton, the Board of the time made several representations to Council concerning development of Willetton Reserve and the early planning for the Burrendah Reserve.

1974 also saw the inauguration of the Junior Sportstar of the Year Award - a concept which has continued success in the promotion of junior sport in the district. Also in 1974 the Club purchased its first long term asset, a storage shed for equipment and \$1000 was offered to the Council for preparation of a plan for Burrendah Reserve - "so that the suggested programme of development could proceed without delay".

It was in 1975 that the first real progress towards sporting facilities was made-two tennis courts a cricket wicket and two

etton Reserve was com-pleted. Basketball and netball courts were constructed on Burrendah facilities Reserve-some at last!

The first Willetton Fair was held by the Club in March 1978. Also in that year our membership records were put onto computer and the Board allocated \$2,200 for floodlighting on Will-etton Reserve for football and hockey. A significant decision to conduct our own Jnr Basketball Competition was also during 1978 and lights were installed on four of the courts at Burrendah Reserve. The Snr Sportstar of the year Award was begun when the Rural & Industries Bank offered a perpetual trophy

Another milestone was the entry of our Snr Football into the South Suburban Murray League in 1979. At the same time plans were advanced for the building of our Clubhouse on Burrendah Reserve-the R & I Bank had agreed to a loan to the Council, but Council did not include it on their priority list for loans in 79/80. In the event, Council was unable to fill its loan programme and after consideration by two Council meetings a self-supporting loan of \$350,000 was approved on the condition that the Club contributed \$56,000 to the initial cost of construction. A special general meeting of club members was called in April 1980 to gauge what support there was for the proposed club house project. Even though it involved a huge commitment to fundraising the meeting gave the project its unahimous backing. Special fund raising committeees were set up and the "Clubhouse 81" project began almost immediately. 
