the premiership ladder, we hope to be able to report some good success in next issue.







## SENIOR FOOTBALL

The end of the home and away seaon saw Willetton senior football represented by all grades in the finals. Sunday, August 28th saw the Sunday sides make their finals appearance, the League took on Kelmscott in the cut-throat elimination final on Kelmscott's home turf. After a tough a physical first half, Willetton led by 18 points at half time. Craig Baines, at centre half forward, was playing strongly and the defence of Steve Perejmibda, Michael Fairnie, David Glass and James Perejmibda was making life difficult for the Kelmscott forward line.

The third quarter saw Willetton increase its lead to 28 points and Justin Keen, in the ruck and up forward was causing problems for the Kelmscott defence.

In the last quarter the Blues opened up with three quick unanswered goals, which put the game out of Kelmscott's reach. The side went on to kick twelve goals in the last quarter to run out eventual winners 22 goals 11 points to 8 goals 6 points.

The Reserves and Colts played the qualifying finals at Gosnells after both sides finished the season in second position on the ladder. The Colts took on Osborne Park in a hard-fought game, at the final siren Willetton emerged five point winners. Final score, Willetton 7.9, Osborne Park 6.10.


