GAMING MACHINES

Video lottery terminals, to be known as V.L.T.'s, have been permitted by the State Government into licensed clubs and hotels.

These machines are **not poker** machines and have been introduced as an advanced product of "Bingo Tickets" or "Break Opens".

The maximum allowable at this time is two (2) per establishment although the regulations will allow five (5). The Government is being extremely cautious in their approach to the introduction.

I am fully aware that gaming is not acceptable in all areas of the community, however I consider that time will tell if gaming is to be accepted by the majority.

CARRY THOSE CARDS

Many members are still resisting the Club requirement for members to produce their membership card when entering the clubhouse.

Members should be aware that this requirement is essential if the Club is to avoid running foul of the Liquor Act requirements.

Yes, it is sometimes a little inconvenient to have to search your pockets, purse or wallet for the card as you enter the foyer, but for the sake of your Club please co-operate.

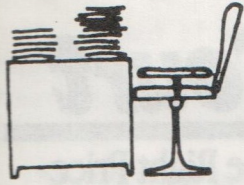
